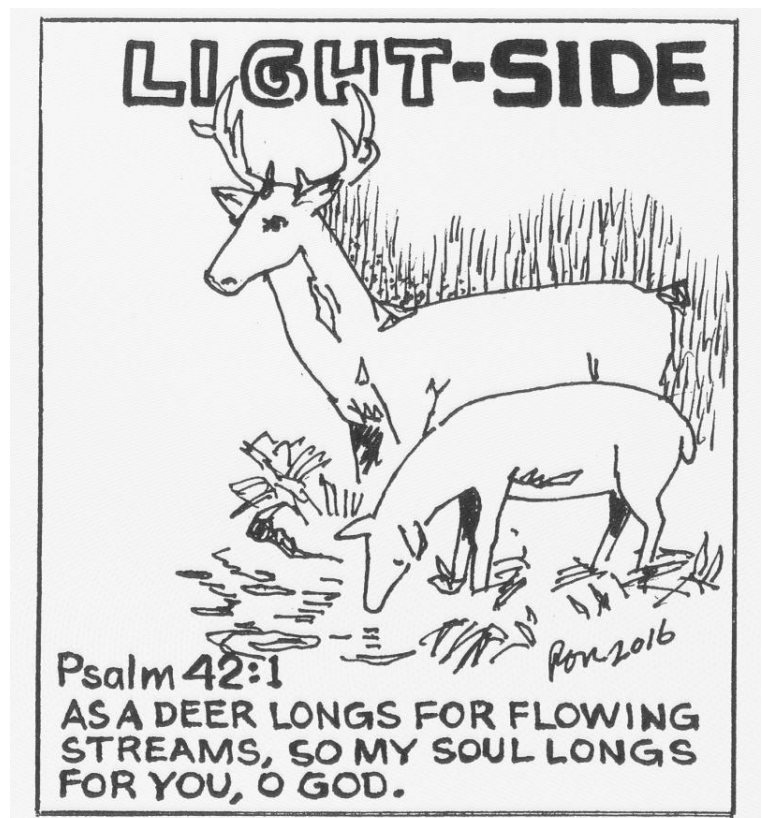

Dear Friends,

The celebration of the resurrection of our Savior on Easter Sunday is for sure, the highlight of the Christian calendar. Without Jesus’ victory over death, our faith, as the Apostle Paul informed the Corinthians, is futile. So it’s important to spend our time reflecting upon this sublime truth.
