Pastor's Message

September 2017

I recently returned from a Pastor's conference focusing on the subject of worship, which in its most basic form means ascribing worth to God, and "treasuring Him above all things" (John Piper). This was a nice opportunity to really reflect upon how we as Christians should relate to our Lord. The Bible uses three distinct Greek words to properly convey the appropriate meaning of this important concept. The word Latreuo speaks to the act of worship as service to God. I find that particularly interesting because we normally think of worship as taking place exclusively during Sunday mornings service, where Latreuo seems to find a slightly different emphasis. Romans 12:1 is helpful here: "*Therefore I urge you brethren by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of* **worship**."

The apostle Paul encourages believers in Jesus to see worship as a lifetime privilege that extends well beyond the wall of the church building to include the entire life experience. Now, this doesn't mean we do nothing but bow and pray through the day. Rather, our hearts are becoming more and more oriented toward thinking about God's greatness; and how we can become more like the people He has created us to be. God becomes the priority in my life rather than Brad Kramer being the all-consuming focus. There is a sense I which I learn to incorporate Jesus into all aspects of my day. I love that idea because it places our Savior in His rightful place. If my worship of God takes place only on Sunday mornings, then I really won't have a close relationship with Him and I certainly won't be treasuring Him above all things. In next month's Herald, I will suggest some concrete ways in which we can better worship the Lord in our daily lives.
