Pastor's Message



August, 2018

Dear JCC Members and Friends,

It was sometime in early 2010, when Pastor Luke Choi asked me to assist him on a part time basis at the Japanese Church of Christ. I had filled the pulpit for Pastor Luke on a couple of occasions prior to his offer so I was comfortable with the congregation; I was also contemplating a change in ministry direction and this role seemed like a good fit until I could find a more permanent pastoral position.

As is often the case in life, I was thrown a curve a few months later when Pastor Luke informed me that he would be taking a job in Ohio and asked if I might be interested in taking over the Senior Pastor position, pending a vote of the congregation. Today, I look back and thank God for moving my friend Luke back to Ohio, because it opened up an opportunity for which I will always be profoundly grateful – to serve as pastor of JCC.

Of course, as a "hakujin", there was much I needed to learn about the Japanese culture if I was to minister effectively. But any concerns I may have entertained about "fitting in" were soon put to rest. My wife and children and I were embraced warmly from the very beginning, and we were humbled by the generosity and kindness of our new family. There were many instances of special support and affirmation in those first couple of years, but one stands out as particularly meaningful - I was visiting one of our congregants, Shig "Doc" Matsukawa, who was in the final months of his life. I had great admiration for "Doc" as a godly man as well as one of many military heroes in our church family. I had only been with the church a few months and told Doc how I wanted to succeed as pastor of JCC. I think he sensed a lack of confidence in my words, as he said very firmly, "Brad you know and I know, that you are the man for the job!" I can't overestimate the lasting value of his words. His support and confidence in me has been echoed and reaffirmed to me by so many others in my church family through these 8 years. I can honestly say that I have never been more honored to serve in a job as I have been at JCC.

From the many who were unjustly imprisoned behind the fences at Topaz; to the wide eyed youth who let me tag along each summer at Mt. Hermon; from the bereaved who taught me how to face deep personal heartache and to bravely carry on; to all those who patiently listen to my sermons and then speak words of encouragement - I have been welcomed into the most special of families. I thank Jesus for graciously allowing me to serve alongside such amazing people. Congratulations on 100 years of tireless work and service and thank you for leaving such a profound mark on my life.

Big Changes Coming!

The 100th Anniversary celebration has been a great motivator for our congregation. About 6 months ago, Chris Jensen, an architect from Think Architecture, expressed his desire to help a non-profit organization to Julee Mori. As a result, a group of members got together with Chris to discuss how to correct three key issues: safety concerns, issues with health department food inspectors specifically related to JCC's kitchen facilities during major events like Aki Matsuri and Nihon Matsuri, and the need to improve (and use) WiFi (internet) access. After discussion, the group realized these facilities would be required if, and when, we began remodeling of the Sanctuary.

The committee members are: Chris Jensen, Think Architecture (donating time for design), Greg Paige, Jan Aramaki, Lorraine Crouse, Steve Fukumitsu, Al Kubota, Pastor Brad, Julee Mori, Karen Okawa, Laura Olson, Karla Paige and Paul DeRose. We sought input from other congregational members from time to time on specific items.

Project Description:

- Wiring to extend WiFi access to the sanctuary is about 50% complete. Work is scheduled to improve sound capabilities from the sanctuary to the Fellowship Hall prior to the 100th Anniversary celebration.
- Contact with State, City and National Historic groups led to the conclusion that we can modify the Fellowship Hall as long as we maintain the existing building footprint.

Planning to remodel the Fellowship Hall to include:

- 2 fully compliant ADA uni-sex restrooms on the main floor, equipped with baby changing stations.
- Reconstructing the stairway to be safer (not as steep with resized stair treads, both rise and run).
- Relocating the main entry location to avoid conflict with the modified stairway.
- Include a functional drinking fountain and water bottle filling station.
- Update the kitchen to meet current health dept. food inspector guidelines for Aki Matsuri and Nihon Matsuri, plus Fellowship dinners and congregational functions.
- Improve the electrical wiring in the kitchen area.
- Provide for folding door panels to close off the kitchen when the Fellowship Hall is in use.
- Update the glass and sliding glass doors to meet safety and energy efficiency codes, possibly enhancing them with a Japanese motif as we look into the courtyard/garden area.
- Reface the front of the stage and replace the curtains, support hardware, pull ropes and mechanism.

Keep in mind the work previously completed by Building Gods Way for the Sanctuary remodel and construction of a walkway between the buildings. Due to the stairway modification and the construction of the bathrooms, some redesign of the proposed walkway will be required before that project begins. Right now, the timing for that project is unknown.

Work is now well underway on completing the restroom and stairway modification designs. The committee has compiled a "wish list" for kitchen equipment, which is being priced out and design criteria compiled. The architect and Restaurant Store Equipment Company (Resco) will be working on a proposed design in the next 3-4 weeks based on our wish list. Once design is complete and JCC approves the design, we can construct a cost estimate.

What you can expect (as a tentative and optimistic schedule) as we move forward:

- We hope to file for a building permit by the end of August.
- Once secured, we hope work will begin on the restrooms and the stairway modification in October and will take approximately 2 months to complete.
- During construction on the stairway, access to the basement will be temporarily (2-4 weeks at most) impacted for safety reasons due to single egress via the west stairwell in the event of a fire.
- We will have construction materials, etc. at the back of the Fellowship Hall so we will need to be safety conscious.
- We need to coordinate with the Tongan and Kachin congregations to minimize impact on their fellowship activities.
- By December, hopefully before Christmas services, we should be wrapping up the first "phase" of construction.
- In January 2019, kitchen modification will begin. Again, we will need to be safety conscious during this period.
- We also need to plan for the Nikkei Center event (typically held in February at JCC). We might need to schedule a different month for 2019.
- Construction on the kitchen should be complete by the end of April. Again, we need to plan for Nihon Matsuri 2019.

The Fellowship Hall Remodel Committee will make periodic updates as information becomes available.
