Pastor's Message

July 2019

In his book, "The Purpose Driven Life", Pastor Rick Warren takes a few pages to tackle the issue of surrendering to God. This form of "surrender" is really a matter of submitting myself daily to God's gracious guidance in my life. The Apostle Paul captures this idea in Romans 12:1 - I urge you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship.

I agree with Warren that surrender, or "presenting ourselves to God" is best demonstrated by obedience and trust. This is not always easy of course. For example, consider the man who has just lost his job and still has to find a way to provide for his family. Or the young woman who is diagnosed with a serious disease and is forced to contemplate her promising life being cut short. And to be honest I have struggled with trusting God in some of the most trivial circumstances. Let's face it, surrendering to God can be very difficult. I'd like you to consider the words of C.S.Lewis in describing what can result when we learn to turn our troubles and ourselves over to God.

"The more we let God take us over, the more truly ourselves we become – because He has made us. He invented all the different people that you and I were intended to be...It is when I turn to Christ, when I give myself to His personality, that I first begin to have a real personality of my own."


