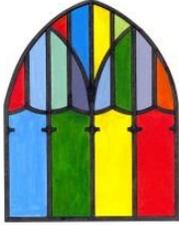


During this time, let us uplift and reassure our church family in Christ. We pray you will be drawn closer to God and find comfort in His Word.

Instructions to install the client portion of this software are given on **Page 4** of this newsletter. Paul DeRose was kind enough to compile this very comprehensive list of combinations of machines and operating systems. You will need this client before you can join the meeting.

Next week, Greg will send an “invitation” to join the meeting. Send an email to [jccherald \[at\] gmail \[dot\] com](mailto:jccherald[at]gmail[dot]com) to be added to this invitation. On Sunday morning, click the link in the invitation and then you can join the bible study. Since we are using a trial version (free) of the software, we will be limited to a 40 minute window. If this works well, we’ll look to purchase a paid level of service for a monthly fee. Please be patient as there may be some bugs to work out in the process!

Earthquake

Many along the Wasatch Front were awakened to the 5.7 magnitude earthquake on March 19. The epicenter of the quake was in Magna, Utah, west of downtown SLC and some buildings were severely impacted; but some downtown area buildings also sustained structural damage. The initial report was there was no damage to the JCC chapel, Fellowship Hall or any of the utility lines; however, inspections are ongoing and some of the doorway and window frames were found to have small cracks.

April 2020 - Easter

If you're like me, you are still reeling from the events this past month relating to the spread of the Coronavirus. It has been a difficult reality to process, hasn't it? Part of the reason is due to the fact that this is the first time in most of our lives that we have experienced a pandemic of this nature. Some or most of us are having our worlds rocked a little bit by all the drama.

When Jesus came on the scene 2000 years ago, He, of course, brought much drama with Him. Most people did not know what to make of Him or His teaching. The religious leaders were the group who experienced the most acute disorientation, because Jesus was bringing a message at odds with their narrow understanding of God. Instead of truly listening to Jesus and accepting His truth claims, their ultimate response was to kill Him.

There was of course, a different response from the followers of Jesus: in spite of the difficulty in processing some of His claims, the disciples of our Lord stayed the course and committed to Him up until His death. But even His followers were so shaken that they threw in the towel after His crucifixion. But this is where the story takes a remarkable turn – the crucifixion was only the first part of the story. We know the rest; Jesus miraculously rose from the dead, completing the task for which he was sent – to redeem sinful men and women from the penalty of sin. Upon seeing their crucified Master in the flesh, the disciples would never be the same. Their response was to go out into the world and proclaim the saving message of the gospel, at great cost to themselves. On the other hand, the response of the religious leaders, at least most of them, was to ignore this greatest of miracles (the resurrection), and instead cover it up by spreading lies. They ran from the truth that was intended to set them free. In their pride, they refused to consider the possibility that the Messiah had arrived and had made possible a personal relationship with the God of the Universe. A relationship secured not by going to synagogue, or Bible study, or baptism, but simply by trusting in this Jesus who conquered death on our behalf.

There is one more group to consider though. And that is the group of people who like the person of Jesus, attend church, and play an active role in their religious community. Yet, they do not have a relationship with Jesus because it's not that important or necessary. They like the idea of Jesus but only as an addition to an already full schedule. I have a great concern for these people, because I fear they are counting themselves as true followers of Jesus when perhaps they are not at all.

During this Easter season, would you please take the time to consider where you stand with Jesus? Have you taken the time to truly place your trust in him and what He did for you? Do you love Jesus and hate your sin? Or are you simply going through "religious motions" because it is what you've always done, without regard for Who He really is? In the midst of a global virus pandemic, these are still the most important questions in your life.

The Fellowship Hall remodel is complete now that we've received the "occupancy permit" and the commercial kitchen approval. Work continues to remediate some serious water damage discovered while starting to install new flooring in Pastor Brad's office. It is expected to take another month or so given limitations of COVID-19, on materials and delivery, to complete.

Even with all of this, we are within budget. God has plentifully supplied JCC with financial means and builders!
