Pastor's Message

I have been reflecting on the biblical story of Zacchaeus. You remember Zacchaeus? He was the little man from Jericho who climbed a tree to get a better view of Jesus passing through, not realizing that his life would be changed dramatically as a result of his meeting with the Savior.

This transformation of a hated tax collector doesn't take place without a recognition by Zacchaeus of a need to bring change to his life. He had to resolve to change.
