Pastor's Message

April 2016

The book of Acts in the New Testament, chronicles the early history of the Christian Church and features one of my favorite biblical characters; the Apostle Paul. One of the most compelling aspects of Paul is the stunning transformation he experienced from a persecutor of the church to its most influential missionary. Throughout his ministry, Paul exhibits a single-minded devotion to proclaiming the gospel of Jesus. In fact, he willingly undergoes beatings and imprisonments in order that people would come to understand the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

In one instance, Paul is arrested and imprisoned by the Roman authorities. Acts 26 records his defense before King Agrippa and the Roman governor Festus. At the end of Paul's powerful testimony, the King, who is not a man of high character comments – "In a short time you will persuade me to become a Christian". Paul's response in verse 29 sums up his great compassion for even the worst of sinners:

"Short time or long--I pray to God that not only you but all who are listening to me today may become what I am."

I hope that the Lord would cultivate that type of devotion and compassion within all of our hearts.




Shodo is an art form that has been studied for over 3000 years. It is a combination of skill and imagination.
