Pastor's Message

July 2016

One of the most potent verses in all of scripture is found in Ephesians 4:32, where the Apostle Paul instructs followers of Jesus to "be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." The real challenging part of this call for Christian love is found in the modifying phrase – just as in Christ God forgave you."

What this means is that we are to put no conditions or restrictions on extending forgiveness to others. When a person places his or her faith in Jesus as Savior, and confesses their sinful nature, God does not accept them only if their sin is kept within acceptable limits; because there are no limits. The Psalmist rejoiced in the fact that as far as the east is from the west, so far has he (God) removed our transgressions from us.

If God, Who is without sin, can forgive all of our sin, no matter how ugly and wretched, can we not extend the same grace to fellow sinners? As we respond in obedience to this command, we discover great freedom. Lewis Smedes understood this when he said – "When you release the wrongdoer from the wrong, you cut a malignant tumor out of your inner life."

Granted this is easier said than done. How can we let go of the deep hurts caused by other people? I will close this letter with a very insightful and practical suggestion from writer Ken Boa:

"As an exercise before God, take a piece of paper and write down the names of those who have hurt you over the years through disloyalty and betrayal. Offer this list to God along with all the pain it rekindles, and make a choice through faith in Christ to forgive each person on the list. Then crumple the paper and burn it before the Lord Who forgave you from the cross."

May God bless us as we seek to forgive others,
