<u>The Gift of Christmas</u>, written by the late James Montgomery Boice has become a great resource over the years for me. Boice offers great insight into the significance of this event celebrated the world over time and time again each December. I admit I get caught up in the festiveness of the Christmas season; it really is, as the great Andy Williams sang, the most wonderful time of the year. But it's important to ask ourselves, "Why is it so wonderful?" <u>The Gift of Christmas</u> offers some compelling answers to this question.

In one of the final chapters, Boice tackles the issue of how to celebrate Christmas. I have reprinted a small segment of the chapter for your consideration:



"How do you celebrate Christmas? If we are honest, we must admit that many persons, even Christians, celebrate it by watching football games on TV, decorating their houses, visiting relatives and friends, or buying presents. By far the best and greatest way to celebrate Christmas is by becoming a Christian if you have never done so. Anyone can understand Christmas by just three propositions: 1) I am a sinner; 2) as a sinner I need a Savior; 3) Jesus is that Savior. If you have never done that, then Christmas is a great season in which to believe in Him."

For the Christian, Montgomery Boice offers 4 ways in which we can make the most of the Christmas celebration:

"1) Tell others about it; 2) To wonder at the event itself; 3) To ponder its meaning; 4) To glorify and praise God for what was done at the first Christmas."

As we come together as a church family this season, we have the opportunity to worship on back-to-back days as Christmas falls on a Sunday. I look forward to celebrating with you at our special Candlelight service at 5:00 p.m. Christmas Eve, and then the following morning at 10:30 a.m. Let's join together this year as the family of God to rejoice in our Savior's birth.

Advent Season 2016

The season of Advent is the four-week period before December 25th when we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. During Advent we get ready to welcome Jesus into our lives by reading Scriptures, sharing special Advent readings, lighting the candles on our Advent Wreath and praying together.

Three candles are purple to represent royalty, because Jesus is our eternal King. One candle is pink to represent the joy we feel when Jesus comes to our world. The last candle, the Christ Candle, is white to represent the holiness and purity of Jesus, our Savior. We light the Christ candle on Christmas Eve as we read the story of Jesus' birth in the Gospel of Luke.
