Pastor's Message

After preaching from the book of Luke for the past 11 months, I've decided to take a six week break and explore the topic of Trust. You might ask, "why not finish Luke and then launch into a new topic?" It's a great question for which I don't have a great answer. Other than to say, I feel compelled to tackle this subject sooner than later; perhaps this is a case of God leading me on a different but significant preaching path. I'd like to think so. Whatever the reason, I believe this is an important subject for God's people to consider deeply.

In his book Ruthless Trust, the late Brennan Manning claimed "The essence of biblical faith lies in trusting God". I think he is right. There must be trust in God in order to truly believe in Him, and His care for us. And as Manning observes, that trust needs to be "renewed daily". In other words, every day seems to bring new opportunities or temptations to mistrust the goodness and sovereign care of our Lord. It is in those moments where we make the choice either to put our faith in God's sufficiency, or trust in our own devices. Invariably, the latter path leads to disappointment, and sometimes-even heartache.


I am excited for us to journey together through God's word, trusting His Holy Spirit to convict, teach and transform us through His matchless power.
