

Pastor's Message

March 2019

I'd like you to consider the story about Jesus and the Samaritan woman from John 4. This is an incredible encounter that reveals some beautiful truths about our Savior, and how we can respond to His example.

The story opens in verse 4, as the gospel writer tells us that Jesus was on His way to Galilee but had to go through Samaria to get there. The truth is, no Jewish person would ever think to go through Samaria to get anywhere because of the mutual hatred between the two groups. They would invariably take the long way around. But not Jesus; not today. He was on a mission to bring the gospel to a despised people group.

Once arriving in Samaria, Jesus stops at a well and begins a conversation with a local woman of questionable moral character. Simply by talking with this woman, Jesus is crossing a cultural line; but that doesn't matter. During the course of their conversation, the woman comes to suspect that Jesus may indeed be the long awaited Messiah. She runs back into the city, declares what she has heard from Jesus and brings a good number of the townspeople back to see Jesus. Our Lord ends up staying two days with the Samaritans, having an enormous impact. Verse 42 – "They said to the woman, "it is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is indeed the Savior of the world."

Allow me to give you a couple of points to chew on:

- 1. When the Bible says that Jesus loves the world, that is exactly what it means. As a Jew, He had no business being in Samaria, much less witnessing to them. Yet, His love and compassion constrained Him to break man made rules in order to save souls.
- 2. Can you and I find it in our hearts to reach out to unlovable or even hated people groups? God's love knows no such barriers. Why does ours?
- 3. Notice that the Samaritans believed when they heard the message of Jesus. The word of God has power. But it needs to be heard.

Perhaps you and I can take steps to share this life transforming word with someone else in the coming days ahead. Who knows; we may help to change someone's life.



Fellowship Hall Remodel Update

The Fellowship Hall Remodel Committee held a meeting on February 12 to restart the project. Here are some highlights of the meeting:

1. Unfortunately, due to minimal progress, JCC decided to stop working with Chris Jensen, the architect that initially started the project. In January, Ralph Nagasawa, a local architect, agreed to assist the church and began work on design drawings that will form the basis of a submittal to Salt Lake City Corporation for a building permit. The committee reviewed the work to date and had a good discussion of possible options.

2. Two "wish lists" were compiled as part of the 2018 work. These were presented to Ralph Nagasawa while the committee reviews them to ensure we have not missed any "wishes".

3. The committee looked at possible finishes during the February meeting too. It is still too early to decide these finishes, so a final decision will be made as the project progresses.

4. The committee feels that we are making good progress at this time and asks that you continue to pray for wisdom, proper perspective and good communication for all committee members.
