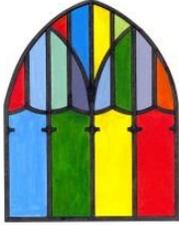

## Pastor's Message

January 2020

If you're like me, one of the things you would like to see change this next year is the level of shrill and ugly discourse in the political sphere. Unfortunately, I'm not referring only to politicians when it comes to demeaning and harmful language. The verbiage I have seen and heard coming from ordinary citizens has been in some cases utterly repugnant, with insults often taking on a highly personal tone. What's even more discouraging is the number of Christians engaging in such folly. Many of us are asking, "when will this madness end?" In fact, the late Marvin Gaye's beautiful cry for peace in his song, What's Goin' On?, is still timely: "we've got to find a way, to bring some understanding here today". One solution, I believe to this problem is a recognition of our biblical role as citizens.

The Apostle wrote to first century Christians about the importance of a godly perspective regarding a country's leaders:

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way.

Note that Paul does not say we are to pray for some leaders, but for all. If we as followers of Jesus were to take that command more seriously, I believe the political discourse in our country would take on a much more civil tone.

What are we waiting for?


