

Pastor's Message

March 2020

As of this writing, I am preparing to leave for Kampala, Uganda on a one week trip to train African pastors. You may remember back in October of 2019, I spent a week in Baku, Azerbaijan doing something very similar. This time I will be serving under the direction of K.E.S.T. – Kampala Evangelical School of Theology, and I will be team teaching with my friend Steve White, a Pastor from Park City.

The seminary president in Kampal has asked us to teach from the Old Testament book of Isaiah. This is a great prophetic book that ultimately offers hope to the nation of Israel in the midst of their suffering. The challenge will be to take Isaiah's 66 chapters and distill it into 4 days worth of material in a way that will really get to the hearts of the 20 - 30 pastors attending the conference.

These men will be coming to Kampala from various parts of Uganda in order to receive formal biblical teaching, which is very rare in their country. And this is the real joy for me: to have the privilege of teaching the Bible to men who are hungry to learn from God's word, and desire to then teach it to others. What usually happens on trips like this, is that I am the one who gets richly blessed. And it happens by simply interacting with people whose customs and traditions differ significantly from mine, but with whom I share a deep love for our Savior, Jesus Christ.
