Pastoral Message

March 2022

I greet you in the name of Jesus Christ who was, is, and is to come. I also bring greetings on behalf of the whole of the Rocky Mountain Conference of the United Church of Christ. It is our joy to stand with JCC as a partner in covenant and ministry. In this season of pandemic, pastoral transition, isolation, and ambient anxiety, I invite you to ponder grief.

Grief is sneaky. One moment, you may feel, aside from the loss you have suffered, that all is well. In the next moment, grief shows up and manifests itself in whichever ways it sees fit. Grief is an emotional process which may begin following a loss or change of any kind. The sort of change or loss commonly thought to precipitate the grieving process is the death of a relative or friend. However, any and every change in life's journey IS a loss of a sort. If by nothing else, the grief process can be brought on by a rift in our understanding of what was. David Whyte, 21st century poet mused about grief as a well. While it is true that the well is filled with life giving water, the grief process can be akin to falling into the well and finding oneself overwhelmed, overcome, drowning.

Beloved, pastoral transitions usher in a season of loss and change. The one called into your community to administer the sacraments, baptism and communion, as well as markers along life's journey such as weddings, funerals, counseling, and prayer. Pastor Kramer's departure, without regard to the surrounding circumstances, is a loss and change within community which may elicit sadness, anger, depression, joy, numbness, or a mixture of all of these feelings. This is grief. Grief is a journey, not a destination. Grief is a process to help remember and memorialize what has been lost, what might have been, so that you might move forward into what is next. In this season, journey together, as a congregation, into grief. In this season, recommit yourselves to the spiritual disciplines of prayer, Bible study, and reflection. In this season, be still and know that God remains sovereign and will sustain you.

I conclude with sweet hymnody of the church;

Be not dismayed whate'er betide, God will take care of you!

Beneath His wings of love abide, God will take care of you!

God will take care of you, through every day o'er all the way;

He will take care of you; God will take care of you!

The first order of business was to install the new officers of the church:

Individual reports of the annual report were reviewed and approved. The meeting was then turned over to Cascade Corporation which Al Kubota conducted. This was followed by a review of the 2022 budget.

Thank you to all of those who were able to participate in the meeting on Zoom, and a special thank you to those who volunteered to be part of the worship service. Hardcopies of the annual report will be available at the church.



JCC Task Force for Reopening

COVID-19 has drastically changed the way we live. Many of us have severely limited our social interactions to avoid becoming infected. Public health scientists are now accepting that COVID-19 is endemic, i.e., will remain with us in the foreseeable future similar to the flu. In fact, the CDC has opened a new Division to deal with COVID-19 for years to come. Since the epidemic began, science has greatly advanced what we know about the virus and its effects. New vaccines, tests, treatments, and recommendations are coming out almost daily, and things are very different now then the situation when the first cases appeared in the U.S. 2020. CDC is moving away from attempting to track individual cases to tracking hospitalizations due to COVID-19 as a better measure of true impact on the health care system. As the Omicron wave seems to be subsiding, many states are beginning to ease restrictions and masking recommendations in public settings.

Our response as a church must also evolve as time goes on. During the February meeting of the Session, the members decided to re-open the COVID-19 Task Force and ask this group to make recommendations to the Session on how to open up church activities going forward. This includes the reinstatement of in-person worship services. The current Task Force members include Lorraine Crouse, Tomoko Moses, Allyn Nakashima (chair), Karen Okawa, and Lynne Ward. The draft recommendations will address attendance at in-person services and activities, masking and social distancing, food service, music and singing, etc. The draft will be presented at the March Session meeting for their consideration. Hopefully, this will result in the church being able to resume in-person services and other activities soon.



Topaz Stories Exhibit

Thirty one stories of the WWII Japanese American incarceration at Topaz Relocation Center will be on display in the Utah State Capitol Building in 2022. The exhibit opened on January 18 and will be on display through December 31, 2022 on the third floor mezzanine of the Capitol. Hours at the Capitol are from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday through Sunday. A reception will be held on April 22. Senate Bill 58

On Thursday, February 17, 2022, Governor Spencer Cox signed S.B. 58, Day of Remembrance. This bill was sponsored by Senator Jani Iwamoto and received unanimous support from the House and Senate. S.B. 58 designates February 19th as an annual Day of Remembrance observing the incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II.

Lake Tahoe Fellowship Retreat Northern California Japanese Christian Church Fellowship (NCJCCF) Sunday, July 24 - Friday, July 29, 2022

Greetings from the Lake Tahoe Fellowship (LTF) Board!

2019 was our last retreat and then came Covid-19. We're hoping you are healthy and ready to come back. We have missed you.

The dates of the retreat are Sunday, July 24 through Friday, July 29, 2022.

The LTF Board has met several times via zoom since the conclusion of the 2019 retreat. We have compiled thoughtful suggestions from prior evaluations. We would like this to be a safe and great experience.

The Zephyr Point Presbyterian Conference Center has mandated the following: In an effort to protect the health and safety of staff and guests, face coverings are required in the front office and dining services lines, regardless of vaccination status. In all other indoor spaces masks are highly recommended but not required. Guest groups may choose to require masks for their own events in privately rented meeting areas, per the discretion of group leadership. Zephyr Point Staff continue to wear masks in all public and working areas, especially when in proximity of guests.

The fees will include meals and gratuity for kitchen staff for the entire conference, comfortable rooms, snacks, most workshops, other amenities, great fun and fellowship.

There are ways to cut costs if you wish: Volunteer, run a workshop, share your faith journey and/or ensure your registration forms are postmarked by 3/11/22. Our volunteers are truly indispensable! We appreciate their willingness to share their expertise, creativity and invaluable service! You may take one discount, in addition to the early bird discount.

Please consider being a "Faith Journey" speaker. Each individual has their own story and the conference participants always have their faith renewed after hearing these journeys. If you have a talent and would like to run a workshop, please do! We are looking especially for those geared to our male conferees and arts and crafts as this is always mentioned in our evaluations.

The Board also approved a \$50 late registration fee (forms and check postmarked after 3/25/22). Please get your paperwork in on time; this assists us with planning and making our commitments to Zephyr Point.

Cancellation refunds will be prorated depending on when the cancellation is made. No refunds will be given after 7/10/22.

Our keynote speaker this year will be Reverend John Oda. His theme is, "Life Lessons from the Parable of the Prodigal Son". John has been a past speaker, is dynamic and has a story to tell!

Reverend John Oda is a third-generation Japanese American pastor and ordained elder in the California-Nevada Conference who directs the Asian American Language Ministry Plan for The United Methodist Church. He is responsible for supporting and strengthening Asian American churches in the United States. He is currently the Director of the Asian American Language Ministry Program, Global Ministries. He resides in Atlanta, Georgia and took this position in July, 2019 after 21+ years of being a Minister in Northern California.

At each retreat, we designate one evening to install new Officers and have a Memorial Service to remember our loved ones that have passed away in the past year or since our last conference in 2019. If you would like to light a candle in their memory, list your loved ones in the designated area on the registration form.

Please consider taking the bus transportation with United Coach Tours as parking spaces are very limited. The cost of the bus is approximately \$3,000 Round Trip from San Jose to Zephyr Point with stops to and from Berkeley United Methodist Church and Sacramento Japanese United Methodist Church. Cost per person is \$125 from the bay area and \$100 from Sacramento. Maximum on the bus is 48 riders. Any shortfall in riders will cause the excess cost to be funded by the LTF fund (reserves).
