Pastoral Message

October 2022

"From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the Lord is to be praised." (Psalm 113:3)

When you turn 104 years old, you have been around for 37,960 sunrises and 37,960 sunsets. Talk about a rollercoaster ride! Bright sunshine makes way for utter darkness! Life is a constant cycle of losses and new beginnings!

One of my tasks as interim minister is to take inventory. In October of 1918, JCC began ministry in the heart of Japantown. That means in October of 2022, JCC will have seen 37,960 sunrises and 37,960 sunsets. Babies were born, people died. Ministries started and ended. Festivals came and went. Languages faded away and came back. From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the Lord is to be praised. There are many memories to be grateful for in 104 years. There are many scars that remain from losses and struggles.



As part of our mission study process, we will look at many of those ups and downs of the past. And then come two more steps that pertain to the future and to the present: What does JCC need to be, know, and do in order to praise the Lord from the rising of the sun to its setting going forward? Who are the babies and the dying we are sent to? What ministries do we need to start and what ministries do we need to end? What festivals should we celebrate? Which languages should we speak?

The Psalmist invites us to look ahead: "Blessed be the name of the Lord from this time on and forevermore." (Psalm 113:2) The big question is: How are we going to be the church from this time on? Let's hop on that rollercoaster together!

Operation Christmas Child

The kickoff for the Samaritan's Purse "Operation Christmas Child" program will be **Sunday**, **October 2** and shoeboxes will be available to fill with Christmas gift items to be distributed to children in need around the world. Because of the global pandemic, shoebox donations are welcomed more than ever.



The due date is **November 13, 2022**. Remember, DO NOT include toothpaste or candy of any kind and NO LIQUIDS. Please do not include used or damaged items, war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figurines, food, liquid or lotions, breakable items, glass containers, or aerosol cans.

"Filling" suggestions include:

- Toys: small doll, toy truck, stuffed animal, kazoo, harmonica, yoyo, jump ropes
- School Supplies: pens, pencils/sharpener, crayons, markers, stamps and ink pad writing pads or paper, solar calculator, coloring and picture books
- Hygiene Items: toothbrush, comb, washcloth
- Other: T-shirt, socks, ball cap, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, flashlights (with extra batteries)

Every shoebox gift needs a \$10 donation to provide for collecting, processing, shipping, ministry partner training, and the Gospel materials that are given to the children with their gift box.

If anyone cannot assemble a shoebox gift, but wants to participate in this project, please consider a \$10 donation to help get these shoeboxes to the children. Checks can be made to Samaritan's Purse and simply put in the offering box during worship service.
