Baptism FAQs

I am coming up on my first anniversary at JCC. And one of the most frequent theological topics people ask me about is Baptism. So I want to take this opportunity to answer the most frequently asked questions on Baptism right here:



Is the water holy?

No and yes. No because Protestant thought does not have room for a "real benediction" like Catholicism where things are substantially being transformed. It's tap water before, during, and after the act of Baptism. But then also: Yes because all things and all persons are holy to God, just not one more than the other.

Do I have to be baptized to come to heaven?

No, because all things and all persons are holy to God. Baptism by water is your response to God's freely given, prevenient grace.

Do I have to be baptized to be a member at JCC?

Yes, Baptism makes you a member of the Body of Christ and if you choose to join its local expression in the form of this congregation and then you are welcome into membership with voting rights and the right to hold offices.

Is my membership active?

Yes, if you are present in the life of the church. We have people all over the world as members. They may not attend or give, but they feel a vital sense of connection. There is no hard and fast requirement on what activity has to look like.

Is my baptism valid?

Yes, if you were baptized with water and in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. That's the theological answer. Organizationally, any local church is an expression of the body of Christ. Congregations belong to denominations, in JCC's case the Presbyterian Church USA and the United Church of Christ. Our denominations have "a formula of agreement" with the Reformed Church in America and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America which essentially states that there are no differences that separate us. We also share in the "common agreement on the mutual recognition of baptism" with the Roman Catholic Church. On a global level, we belong to the World Council of Churches which unites our Baptism with people all over the world, including the Myanmar Baptist Convention, the Free Wesleyan Church of Tonga, and the United Church of Christ in Japan.




