Pastoral Message

March 2023

From Dust You Were Made and To Dust You Shall Return

We had our first session meeting via Zoom on Ash Wednesday. It was the evening after a major snow storm and we were all safe and warm in our homes. I had a cross smudged on my forehead. That was because I led worship at the VA hospital earlier in the day. Lent is now here and the look of our sanctuary changes with the season once again:

The traditions of Lent are derived from the season's origin as a time when the church prepared candidates, or "catechumens," for their baptism into the Body of Christ. It eventually became a season of preparation not only for catechumens but also for the whole congregation. Self-examination, study, fasting, prayer and works of love are disciplines historically associated with Lent. Conversion—literally, the "turning around" or reorientation of our lives towards God—is the theme of Lent. Both as individuals and



as a community, we look inward and reflect on our readiness to follow Jesus in his journey towards the cross. The forty days of Lent correspond to the forty-day temptation of Jesus in the wilderness and the forty-year journey of Israel from slavery to a new community.

On Ash Wednesday, ashes are placed on the foreheads of the congregation as a symbol that we have come from dust and one day will return to dust. It is one of many Lenten and Easter customs that remind us of our historical connection with Jewish tradition. With this sobering reminder of life's fragility, we begin a spiritual quest that continues until the Easter Vigil, when new members of the church are often baptised and the entire congregation joins in a reaffirmation of baptismal vows. Most of this time of preparation is symbolized by the color Violet, though the season is bracketed by the mourning Black of Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. As an alternative to Violet, some churches have begun to use brown, beige or gray (the colors of rough unbleached cloth like burlap) to reflect the season's mood of penitence and simplicity. The somber colors are a reminder of the unbleached "sackcloth" worn by mourners and penitents in the Jewish tradition.




Old JCC Annual Reports

Session Report - February Meeting

The Session met on February 22, 2023 via Zoom due to the snowstorm that hit Salt Lake that day.

Candice Sweet, Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Utah joined the Zoom meeting as a guest to talk about the duties of the Clerk of Session and Session roles. She emphasized the importance of the Elders' roles as an elected position and that the Clerk of Session does not have to be an active member of Session, but must be an ordained Elder.

Candice can provide training for Session, Deacons and Trustees and tailor the training to our needs. It was decided to focus on Session first so that a Clerk of Session can be assigned. This training will take place on Wednesday, March 1. This will benefit all of the Elders; some have never received formal training. The Clerk of Session will be named after the March 1 training as well as appointing Commissioners to the Presbytery of Utah and the UCC. Other roles were temporarily assigned until the March 1 training.

Reports:

Finance – Julee Mori put together the Profit and Loss statement. Donations for Nihon Matsuri and a JACL event were approved. The Presbytery and UCC per capita amounts were approved for payment.

Buildings and Grounds – The NBA All Star Game weekend affected 2 Sundays but we were still able to have worship service as scheduled. Right now bids on windows for the chapel are under review. Need to get input from the congregation and others on the chapel remodel. Investigating live streaming music with the Ogden Christian Church. Steve will continue in this role.

Worship – Maundy Thursday will be planned for this year. Lorraine will continue in this role.

Personnel – Background checks are in process for the new officers. The JCC annual reports are being scanned. There are some years missing. Important to get these and other documents digitized. Reported results of the pastoral feedback survey. Lynne will continue in this role.

Other roles to be filled: Education (Greg), Membership/Stewardship (Karen and Elise), Mission Study (Steve), Nominations (open), Nichigo (Greg), Kenshin Taiko (Julee).
