Special Offerings

In case you haven't noticed, in our tradition "mission" does not mean what it means for the majority religion in Utah. As Presbyterians, we do not seek to convert people to a particular belief, but we join Jesus's mission in action, "for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." (Matthew 25:35-36)



Throughout the year we take special offerings to support this mission:

- One Great Hour of Sharing with a focus on hunger, disaster, and development during the Lenten season.
- The Pentecost Offering with a focus on children at risk, youth, and young adults.
- Peace & Global Witness with a focus on peacemaking and reconciliation on World Communion Sunday.
- Christmas Joy with a focus on church leaders past, present, and future.

Since the JCC is dual-affiliated with both the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. and the United Church of Christ, we also support the UCC special offerings which happen at the same time and for similar causes: One Great Hour of Sharing (shared with PCUSA), Strengthen the Church (Pentecost), Neighbors in Need (World Communion Sunday), and the Christmas Fund (also for church leaders).

Through Easter, I ask you to please give to the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering.

In 2022, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance granted \$3.1 million in 27 U.S. states and 35 countries. In partnership with Church World Service, 228,318 Gift of the Heart Kits and blankets were distributed.

In 2021, the UCC Wider Church Ministries distributed a total of \$930,043 with most of the funds supporting International Relief and Sustainable Development (46% or \$427,414); development programs of global partners through our 5 Global Ministries area offices (43% or \$396,950); Refugees/Migration (10% or \$95,000), and National Disasters (1% or \$10,679)




Weekly Prayer Zoom Call – Thursdays 9:00 A.M.

Search for a Permanent Pastor – Fast Out of the Gate

In its first five meetings during February, the Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC) has been energetic and committed to honor the responsibility entrusted to it by the congregation. The Mission Study is being used as the foundation to write up the qualities sought in the permanent pastor. In two of the meetings, Executive Presbyter, Rev. Mirjam Haas-Melchior gave the PNC overall quidance and came again to answer questions.

The product of this effort is the Ministerial Discernment Profile (MDP) which is a form provided by the Presbytery. Once the answers are drafted by the PNC, it will be approved by the Executive Presbyter and the Session. Refinement will be made to the MDP. The next step will be to post it on the national Presbytery's web site and as many other places as possible to generate interest in the position. The MDP tells the reader about the JCC such as the congregation size, vision for the church, skills and experience sought. The MDP will also define a pastor's role.

There will be a quiet period of time for the PNC while the MDP and other postings are being contemplated by possible candidate pastors. As a critical mass of applications are received, the PNC will resume its energy and evaluate the applications. More information about this step of the process will be covered in a future Herald article.

The final candidate proposed by the PNC will be approved by the Session and the congregation. PNC members are: Rick Aoki, Jan Aramaki, Lorraine Crouse, Michiko Kenmotsu, Marc Stillman, Nancy Umemura and Lynne Ward.
