THE PENTECOST OFFERING HELPS OUR YOUTH BEGIN LIFE WITH A STRONG START — A SOLID FOUNDATION OF FAITH FORMED IN THE FIRST THIRD OF LIFE, FROM CHILDHOOD THROUGH YOUNG ADULTHOOD.

Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. The Holy Spirit remains with us still, connecting us with the church of the past, continuing to inspire the church of today, and pointing us to the church of the future. Each year, this celebration is marked by receiving the Pentecost Offering which nurtures the faith of those who are the church to come.

Pentecost arrives 50 days after Easter and 10 days after the Ascension — when Jesus ascends into heaven. Jesus and the Scriptures are making an important theological point at Pentecost. Jesus ascends and the church is born. 

The Pastor Nominating Committee has submitted the Ministerial Discernment Profile (MDP) to the Presbytery's national website and with other organizations. A number of churches on the West Coast along with JEMS have been asked to include our call in their respective newsletters and websites.

Interested pastors may indicate their interest within the Presbytery's national website. Additionally, the information about JCC and our vision will be matched to any pastors who are already registered as job seekers in the Presbytery's national website. The PNC will evaluate potential matches and will follow up with pastors whose profiles most closely meet our needs.

Remember that names will be kept confidential amongst the PNC. An applicant may not want their current employer to know they are contemplating another position. It would be unfair to them to have their interest disclosed to anyone outside of the PNC or Rev. Mirjam Haas-Melchior (who is assisting the PNC). And, it would be detrimental to JCC to have a potential strong candidate withdraw because they are concerned about a lack of confidentiality. We hope to begin reviewing applications and sorting through them in May.

Session April Meeting Recap

The April Session meeting was held on Thursday, April 18, 2024. The following items were discussed:

At the beginning of the meeting, Trustee Jani Iwamoto provided an update on the status of Japantown as new developments with the NHL announcement of a hockey team in Salt Lake City and ideas for an entertainment district near the Delta Center may impact the future of what remains of Japantown.

A Funeral Committee is now in place and has had two meetings to develop some procedures in planning funerals and Celebration of Life events. Elder Julee Mori led the committee consisting of Jan Aramaki, Suzanne Hata, Laura Olson, Alan Shino, and Nancy Umemura.

The Presbytery of Utah has requested use of the Fellowship Hall on July 2 for a GA reception. A motion was made to approve this request and passed.

Individual committee reports:

Pastor – Requested organizing a committee (pastor, worship committee, and musicians) to decide on a new hymnal that follows the liturgical calendar. He has asked Kenshin Taiko to perform for Pride Sunday on June 2; and GA Sunday on June 30. The May worship schedule will be Mike Clang on May 5; Mirjam Haas-Melchior on May 12; Pastor Tipiloma Pupua on May 19; Sunday, May 26 is Trinity/Memorial Sunday.

Building and Grounds – Chapel renovation is progressing, but behind about a week due to unforeseen issues discovered during remodeling (pitfall of remodeling an old building).

Finance – P&L for March shows a favorable net income. Nihon Matsuri expenses are coming in.

Membership – Karen attended a Called Meeting of the Presbytery of Utah on 4/13. Overtures were approved to support gun safety in the home and to protect Utah's national monuments and wildlands.

Nichigo – Akiko Oki will begin Japanese cooking lessons on May 7. The class is full.

Personnel – The CLC has posted the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP).

Worship – A rotating monthly schedule will be implemented. There are still some areas to be filled in. If anyone can sign up to be liturgist, scripture reader, or usher, contact Elise.

Kenshin Taiko – Signed contracts for more appearances in the coming months.
